 \rightarrow BYOD

Internet access for High School with network login

VISITORS

→ GUEST

Guest login, limited Internet access, no access to CASD network drives.

It is **IMPORTANT** to make sure your computer is on the correct wireless.



Using your own Technologies?

(i.e. Personal Technologies or BYOD)

- 1. Label your own items
- 2. Identify correct wireless (BYOD)
- 3. Click on INTERNET BROWSER
- 4. Enter your USERNAME & PASSWORD

NOTE: If Steps 3 & 4 are bypassed then wireless connectivity will be dropped.

Care & Maintenance

- **Charge** laptop <u>nightly</u>
- **Reboot** your computer between HOME and SCHOOL to ensure updates are installed
- Keep laptop & charger secure at all times
- Avoid placing books on laptop in backpack
- Avoid food and drink near laptop
- Avoid leaving laptop in vehicle for extended time (excessive heat or cold will damage computer)

Try these steps FIRST...

- 1. Perform a reboot or restart laptop.

 Completely OFF then ON
- 2. Check which WIRELESS you are on.
- 3. Confirm you did LOGIN after connecting to WIRELESS?
